From Amsterdam Airport Schiphol to Amsterdam by taxi

From Amsterdam Airport Schiphol to Amsterdam by train and metro

By public transport your transfer should take not much more time than a taxi ride. The train ride from the airport to Central Station (around € 4 for a single journey) takes about 20 minutes, and from there you transfer to the Metro to Waterlooplein station. All metros departing from the metro terminal at Central Station will stop at Waterlooplein. Get tickets at the airport railway station for both your train ride and a ticket for your metro ride. A taxi ride from Central Station is an alternative if you have a lot of luggage, it will cost you around € 8-10. Please note that the ride is very short, and that some taxi drivers may refuse to do the ride, unfortunately.

Please be aware of pickpockets and luggage thieves on these train and metro lines! They know you are tired after your flight, and not as alert as you would normally be. They are very active on these lines!



From Waterlooplein Metro station to Hermitage (literally a 2 minute walk)

Make sure you get out at the right exit from the station: on the platform it is marked 'Nieuwe Amstelstraat/ Waterlooplein.' When you get to the top of the first set of stairs, you choose for the exit called 'Waterlooplein/Blaauwburg.' When getting to street level, you find the Opera on your right (a large modern white building) and you see a bridge straight in front of you, which crosses the Amstel. Walk toward the bridge, and turn left before the bridge. You then are on the Amstel, and you will find number 35 a few houses down from the corner.

Parking in Amsterdam

Please note that there is paid parking in the city center seven days a week at some € 5 per hour or € 43 per day. If you come by car it is probably easier to use one of the parking garages in the neighborhood: Waterlooplein or Markenhoven . Rates tend to be slightly better, and it avoids having to 'fill the meter' at odd times. A much better deal is a Park & Ride option at the Transferium Arena: around € 6.00 per 24 hours for the first 4 days, including free Metro tickets to deliver you to the Waterlooplein station, just around the corner from Hermitage.
